

A INTERPRETING QUESTION TYPES

For each worksheet, students are given **three types of questions** to assess their comprehension of a particular text:

- **Literal questions ('Right there')** are those which can be found directly in the text.
- **Inferential questions ('Think and search')** follow the literal questions. Inferential questions are implied in the text and require students to think a bit more deeply about what has just been read.
- **Applied questions ('On my own')** require students to think even further about the text and incorporate their personal experiences and knowledge to answer.

'**Try this**' section can be found at the end of each worksheet. This writing section enables students to practise sequential thinking and descriptive writing as well as identify problems and solutions by tapping on their prior knowledge and information provided in the comprehension passage.

Answers for literal questions ('Right there') are always given. Answers for inferential questions ('Think and search') are given where appropriate. Answers for applied questions ('On my own') and 'Try this' section are best checked by the teacher following, or in conjunction with, class discussion.
