

QUANTIFIERS USED WITH COUNTABLE AND UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS

REVIEW

Countable nouns can be used with 'some', 'many', 'a few', 'a lot of', 'plenty of' and 'several'. These words are **quantifiers**.

We put 'a' or 'an' before a **singular countable noun**.

We put 'a' **if the noun begins with a consonant** and 'an' **if it begins with a vowel sound**.

Review these.

- **some** singers
- **many** birds
- **a few** coins
- **a lot of** ants
- **plenty of** flowers
- **several** kittens
- **a** mobile phone
- **an** aeroplane

Certain **quantifiers** are used with **uncountable nouns**. They are 'some', 'much', 'a little', 'plenty of' and 'a lot of'.

Uncountable nouns can also be used alone.

Review these.

- Would you like **some juice**?
- There is **much dust** on the books.
- Add **a little sugar** into the tea, please.
- There is **plenty of soup** in the bowl.
- Put **a lot of pepper** if you like your food spicy.
- **Water** is very precious.
- The **sand** is hot and dry.
