'A' is used **before a singular countable noun which begins with a consonant sound**.

'An' is used **before a singular countable noun which begins with a vowel sound**.

'The' is used when we **refer to a particular** person, animal, place or thing.

'The' is also used before the **superlative form of an adjective**.

**Review these.**

- **The** book you lent me is interesting.
- There is a fast food restaurant at **the** airport.
- Father is **the** tallest person in our family.
- Jenny is **the** best dancer in her school.

'**The**' is used when there is only one thing of its kind.

- **The** sky is dark.
- **The** moon is full tonight.

**No article** is used before proper nouns most of the time and names of games.
