<b>deaf</b>	:	cannot hear
<b>decided</b>	:	made up his mind
<b>discarding</b>	:	getting rid of
<b>edible</b>	:	fit for eating

<b>escaped</b>	:	got away
<b>famine</b>	:	the scarcity of food
<b>flight</b>	:	journey by air
<b>fortnightly</b>	:	once every two weeks
<b>fragile</b>	:	easily broken
<b>ill</b>	:	not well
<b>illiterate</b>	:	cannot read or write
<b>improving</b>	:	getting better and better
<b>inaudible</b>	:	cannot be heard
<b>innocent</b>	:	not guilty
<b>occasionally</b>	:	once in a while
<b>panting</b>	:	out of breath
<b>popular</b>	:	liked by many people
<b>punctual</b>	:	on time
<b>regret</b>	:	feel sorry
<b>repeatedly</b>	:	many times
<b>round the clock</b>	:	day and night
<b>soon</b>	:	in a very short time
<b>spectators</b>	:	people watching the game
<b>stale</b>	:	not fresh
<b>staring</b>	:	looking hard
<b>understand</b>	:	make head or tail of
<b>voyage</b>	:	journey by sea
<b>whispering</b>	:	talking softly
