The **simple future tense** is used to show **a future action using 'shall' or 'will'** or **that a future action is certain to happen using 'going to'** or **an action happening in the immediate or near immediate future using 'about to'**.

Review these.

- I **shall visit** Anna next week.
- They **are going to** plan a farewell party for Mr Lee.
- Please hurry. The train **is about to leave** the station.

The **future continuous tense** is used to show **a continuous action that will take place at some future time** or **a planned action**.

Review these.

- He **will still be studying** in England by next year.
- I **shall be waiting** for Helen after school.

The **future perfect tense** is used to show that **an action will be completed by a certain time in the future**.

Review these.

- The show **will have started** by the time you arrive.
