A **phrasal verb** consists of a verb followed by a preposition. It is used as a single verb with a new meaning.

**Review these.**

- My grandfather has decided to **give up** smoking.  
(stop doing)
- Old Mr Henson **passed away** peacefully last night.  
(died)
- The car **ran out** of petrol before the Smith family arrived  
(used up)  
at their destination.
- The old lift **breaks down** frequently.  
(stops working)
- Can you **get along with** your neighbours?  
(have a friendly relationship)
- His blood-stained shirt **gave** the thief **away**.  
(betrayed)
- The woman **passed out** when she heard the bad news.  
(fainted)
- I find his offer too good to **turn down**.  
(reject)
- I need to **attend to** this matter now.  
(deal with)
- The teacher told his class to **keep up** the good work.  
(maintain)
