A **quantifier** is a word or phrase that is used before a noun **to indicate quantity or amount**.

Many, **several**, **a few** and **a large number of** are **quantifiers used before countable nouns**.

Review these.

- There are **many spectators** in the stadium.
- **Several passengers** were injured in the accident.
- Only **a few students** in the class understood the sum.
- Mr Owen has **a large number of ostriches** on his farm.

'Much', **'a little'** and **'a large amount of'** are **quantifiers used before uncountable nouns**.

Review these.

- The coffee is too sweet. You have put too **much sugar**.
- I just need **a little** more **time** to finish my work.
- Mr Lee spent **a large amount of money** to renovate his house.

'Some', **'any'**, **'plenty of'** and **'a lot of'** are **quantifiers used before countable and uncountable nouns**.

- I gave my sister **some food**.
- There aren't **any people** in the office.
- Is there **any butter** in the fridge?
- There are **plenty of tickets** for the show.
- Peter wants **plenty of jam** on his bread.
