- by **changing 'y' into 'ies'** for **singular nouns** which end in 'y'

- by **changing 'f' or 'fe' into 'ves'** for **singular nouns** which end in 'f' or 'fe'

wives

- by **adding 's'** to some **singular nouns** which end with a vowel and 'y'

- by **adding letters** to **singular nouns** or **changing the spelling**
